The University of Queensland Chamber Singers are a specialist ensemble that draws young vocal artists from across the university to perform diverse repertoire. Under the direction of Graeme Morton - Choral Fellow at the School of Music and Director of Music at St John's Anglican Cathedral, Brisbane - the ensemble focuses on traditional and contemporary choral repertoire including that of Australian composers. The UQ Chamber Singers regularly collaborate with other musicians and contribute to research projects within the university.

The Ensemble has performed in the Red Box (South Bank) as part of the Queensland Festival of Music, and at the University of Queensland's Art Museum, Nickson Room, Customs House and performs regularly at St John's Cathedral. Regional tours (such as to Cairns, Innisfail, and Toowoomba) support the university's engagement with local communities, and the group's research involvement extends from the canonic material from the early Renaissance, to commissions and recent compositions. Recent premieres include Finest Hour, a speech melody work commissioned from the UQ School of Music Senior Lecturer in Composition, Dr Robert Davidson.

In 2017 the ensemble performed an unusual double bill, performing Bach's monumental B Minor Mass with the Brisbane Chamber Choir and the Queensland Symphony Orchestra directed by Stephen Layton. One week later they performed the St Matthew Passion together with other vocal students from the School of Music and The University of Queensland's Pulse Chamber Orchestra, directed by Patrick Murphy. The choir has been broadcast on ABC Classic FM and 4MBS Classic FM.

The Brisbane Chamber Choir is directed by its founding director Graeme Morton. One of Australia's more eclectic choirs, the choir combines musicians from diverse backgrounds and regularly performs in all musical styles from Renaissance repertoire to contemporary music, including premieres and commissions. A regular feature of our annual season has become the performance of cantatas, masses and passions of Johann Sebastian Bach in both concert and liturgical settings.

The ensemble regularly collaborates with other organisations and this year returns to Canberra (where the choir has previously performed the premieres of the *Vietnam Requiem* and the *Prisoner of War Requiem*) to premiere the Peacekeeping Symphony for the Flowers of Peace in partnership with the Australian War Memorial. Earlier this year, the performance of Beethoven's *9th Symphony* conducted by Umberto Clerici signified another successful partnership with the Queensland Symphony Orchestra, with previous performances under maestros Stephen Layton and Dane Lam.

The choir has released a number of recordings including, in 2016, *Mass of the Dreaming*, a celebration of Australian choral music. It features the premiere recording of the Ross Edwards' title work, together with compositions of musical friends Stephen Leek, Matthew Orlovich, Andrew Schultz, Paul Stanhope, Keren Terpstra and Joseph Twist.

The Brisbane Chamber Choir regularly commissions new works, recent commissions include Andrew Ford and Andrew Schultz. The choir is currently the resident Chamber Choir of St John's Anglican Cathedral and an Affiliate Ensemble of the University of Queensland School of Music.

The **National University of Singapore Society Choir** (NUSS Choir) was formed in 1998 with the aim of bringing together members who share a passion for singing. The Choir has come a long way since its establishment and has blossomed into a 50-member strong choir today.

The Choir has made several notable achievements which include attaining Gold and Silver standards at international choral festivals held in Taiwan, Thailand, Hong Kong and Malaysia. The Choir was presented with the Golden Voices Award twice in the Asia Cantate (Thailand and Hong Kong) as well as The Friendship Award at the Voices of Asia (Malaysia) music festivals. In addition, the Choir was presented with the Most Inspiring Choir Award at A Voyage of Songs International Choral Festival in Taiwan in 2017 for being the choir with the most positive attitude that inspires other choirs to lifelong singing.

Locally, the Choir has been active in performing for the Voices of Singapore Festival (2018 – 2020), collaborated with a local choir, Vox Camerata, in their concert at the Victoria Concert Hall (2019), Ode to Joy Virtual Choir Campaign organised by the German Embassy and National Arts Council to celebrate Ludwig van Beethoven's 250th birthday anniversary (2020) and Silver Arts 2021 – an initiative that brings enriching arts programmes to seniors all over Singapore and celebrates meaningful possibilities seniors have in the arts.

In 2022 with the lifting of Covid-19 restrictions on performances, the Choir held their annual concert at Victoria Concert Hall. On 29 May 2023, the Choir had a pre-Brisbane mini concert at the National University of Singapore Society Clubhouse for family and friends.





Adyll Hardy honed his musicianship and singing in numerous award-winning choirs such as the National University of Singapore (NUS) Choir and SYC Ensemble Singers. Under the tutelage of his vocal teacher Thomas Kuek, Adyll achieved a distinction in ATCL Recital in Singing as well as an Advanced Performance Certificate from Trinity College London and LTCL recital in Singing. He attained a Diploma in Conducting and ALCM in Conducting from London College of Music in 2013 and 2015 respectively.

Adyll received the Tan Ean Kiam Arts award from NUS Centre for the Arts in 2012, which honours individuals who have contributed significantly to the arts community as alumni of NUS. As Music Director of the National University of Singapore Society (NUSS) Choir since 2013, he has worked with the choir to attain gold and silver awards and the Golden Voices Award at various international choir festivals in Hong Kong and Taiwan 2014 and 2017 respectively.

Dr. Graeme Morton AM is the founding Director of the Brisbane Chamber Choir.

Graeme is a Senior Lecturer and Choral Conducting Fellow at the University of Queensland and the Director of Music at St John's Anglican Cathedral, Brisbane. For twenty-five years he was Director of Music at St Peters Lutheran College, where he founded the renowned St Peters Chorale. During this time, he cofounded The Australian Voices with Stephen Leek and served as its inaugural Director.

Never tiring to pursue exciting new choral works for his singers and their audiences alike, Graeme is responsible for commissioning and recording many works now regarded as Australian choral classics. He tours and lectures on choral conducting, both in Australia and overseas. As a Churchill Fellow he observed choral leadership in both the United States and Canada.

Graeme is a Fellow of the Royal School of Church Music and received a Prime Minister's Medal and in 2011 was the recipient of the Lord Mayor's Australia Day Cultural Award. Graeme holds a Master of Music (Organ) from the University of Queensland, and as a composer, is published by Augsburg Fortress, Kjos Music, and Morton Music.
